

#### Q3: In which region of the United States do you live?






### Q5: Do you believe that America's current history museums adequately tell the story of women's contributions and experiences?




## Q6: Based on your answer above, do you think that the American Museum of Women's History in Washington, D.C. could potentially help tell the story of women's history in our country?




## Q7: What themes, topics, periods of American history would you like to see highlighted in a women's history museum?




## Q8: There are several women's history related museums across America. How might a national women's history museum in Washington, D.C. impact these regional museums?


### Q9: What factors might you consider important in selecting the site for the American Museum of Women's History in Washington, D.C?


### Q10: Would you be likely to visit an American Museum of Women's History if a nominal fee were required?


### Q11: What kinds of exhibits/modes of learning would you be interested in seeing at this museum?


## Q12: Would you want the American Museum of Women's History to function solely as a traditional museum or would you like it to serve as a research/thought leadership center as well?

#### Q13: How would you like the American Museum of Women's History to be funded?




